- Lockdownmeans to immediately clear the hallways, lock and/or barricade doors, hide from
 view, and remain silent whileardying a plan of evacuation as a last resort. Lockdown will
 only end upon physical release from the room or secured area by law enforcement.
 Lockdown is initiated during incidents that pose an immediate threat of violence in or around
 the school.
